1. Manuscript submission

Manuscripts may be submitted by e-mail to the journal manager of the *Journal of Health Law* at: kaldenbach@brill.nl.

Authors are requested to retain a file copy of materials submitted. The file should be typed as flat text, with as little formatting as possible.

The manuscript should include the following:

- a) a 100-word abstract, submitted on a separate page with the manuscript title as the heading; 3-8 keywords.
- b) a separate title page or cover letter containing the author's name, institutional affiliation, address, a contact telephone number, fax number and e-mail address.

The *European Journal of Health Law* requires no financial contribution to cover editorial or any other publication expenses.

If the manuscript is accepted, the author will receive one set of page proofs in PDF. Any corrections must be returned to the publishers without delay to avoid delay in the production schedule. Only typographic errors should be corrected at this stage, a charge may be made for any substantial alterations to the manuscript.

2. Manuscript preparation

Manuscripts should be between 30 and 65 double-spaced (12-pt font) typewritten pages, including abstract, keywords, tables, figures, notes and appendices.

The manuscript should contain a title of no more than 50 characters.

Regarding all matters of form, particularly documentation and references, manuscripts should be prepared according to the instructions below.



Punctuation

Type one space only after full stops. One space after other punctuation marks where grammatically appropriate is sufficient.

3. Style

Headings

The style for headings is as follows:

First level heading: 2 white lines of space above the heading, and one below it.

1. Introduction

Second level heading: 1 white lines of space above the heading, and one below it.

1.1. *The Second Level is Italicised*

Third level heading: 1 white line of space above the heading, and none below it.

1.1.1. *The Third Level is also Italicised*

Certain basic elements of style should be consistent throughout such as:

- spelling: use the spelling checker and search function to ensure that spelling is correct and consequent
- double quotes, but double if a quote within a quote
- dates: e.g, 21 July 1995
- years: 1985--1989 (not: 1985-89)
- figures: 121--122 (not: 121-22)
- currency, e.g. USD, AD, UKP
- titles, e.g. Mr. or Mr
- 10 (figures in numerals)
- percent (% in tables)
- Article 17, Arts. 30--39
- para. 7; paras. 7--9
- Section 4, s.4.
- i.e.
- e.g.
- etc.
- -ise or -ize (suffixes) but not both
- co-ordinate or coordinate
- *The Times, the Independent* (and other newspapers)
- Member States (of the EU)
- 20th century
- (Article, paragraphs, section spelled out in text, abbreviated in parenthesis and footnotes)
- *case v. case* (v. Roman or not)
- USA, EC, OECD

Citation of Journal Articles

Author name, Initial(s)), title of article within double inverted commas, full journal title in italics or abbreviated in roman, volume, issue number, date between brackets, page number(s):

Citation of Cases

Citations to cases should follow the style of the country of origin, including the date of the case, except for cases from common-law jurisdictions. The name of the jurisdictions and of the review or law report in which the case is published should be included. The names of the parties in cases from common-law jurisdictions should be in italics. The abbreviation "v." (for versus) should be in roman:

HR 14-4-1989, NJ 1989, 469.

Lord Napier and Ettrick v. Hunter [1993] 2 W.L.R. 42; [1993] 1 Lloyd's Rep. 197.

Cross-references should preferably not use "above" and "below" but rather "*supra*" and "*infra*".

5. Figure files

All artwork files included with manuscripts accepted for publication must be high resolution (300 dpi or higher). Any text should not be smaller than corps 8. The figures should be at the correct size for the journal's typesetting area.

6. Editorial decisions

Authors of submitted manuscripts will receive acknowledgment of receipt of their manuscripts by e-mail or fax within several business days. Within eight weeks, authors can expect to receive a decision via e-mail regarding the acceptance of their manuscripts for publication in the *European Journal of Health Law*.

7. Consent to publish

Transfer of copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.



Open Access

In case the author wishes to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish**.
