The *Journal of the Economic and Social History of the Orient (JESHO)* contains studies extending our knowledge of the economic and social history of what was once labeled as the Orient: the Ancient Near East, the World of Islam, and South, Southeast, and East Asia. 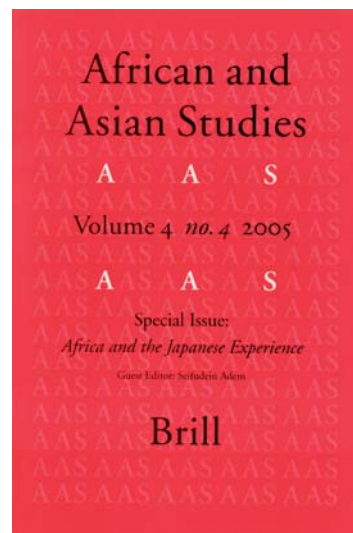
