Instructions for Authors

Scope

IMAGES (IMA) is intended to be a meeting place for scholars across disciplines and continents who engage Jewish art and visual culture from Greco-Roman antiquity to the present day. Articles may focus on all geographical regions in which Jewish participation in visual culture and art had an impact, and come from all relevant disciplines, ranging from architecture, painting and sculpture, to treasury arts, book arts, graphics, textiles, photography, and film, and other areas of the visual experience. *IMAGES* will include articles on historiography and theory, as well as textual studies that reflect on the themes of the journal.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

Submission of an article for publication in any of Brills' journals implies the following:

1. All authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the journal.
2. The contents of the manuscript have been tacitly or explicitly approved by the responsible authorities where the research was carried out.
3. The manuscript has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language, except as an abstract, part of a published lecture or academic thesis.
4. The manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal.
5. If accepted, the author agrees to transfer copyright to BRILL and the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any form, in English or any other language, without prior written consent of the Publisher.
6. If the submission includes figures, tables, or large sections of text that have been published previously, the author has obtained written permission from the original copyright owner(s) to reproduce these items in the current manuscript in both the online and print publications of the journal. Online Submission

IMAGES now uses online submission only. Authors should submit their manuscript online via the Editorial Manager (EM) online submission system at: editorialmanager.com/ima.

First-time users of EM need to register first. Go to the website and click on the "Register Now" link in the login menu. Enter the information requested. When you register, select e-mail as your preferred method of contact. Upon successful registration, you will receive an e-mail message containing your Username and Password. If you should forget your Username and Password, click on the "Send Username/Password" link in the login section, and enter your first name, last

name and email address exactly as you had entered it when you registered. Your access codes will then be e-mailed to you.

Prior to submission, authors are encouraged to read the 'Instructions to Authors'. When submitting via the website, you will be guided stepwise through the creation and uploading of the various files.

A revised document is uploaded the same way as the initial submission. The system automatically generates an electronic (PDF) proof, which is then used for reviewing purposes. All correspondence, including the editor's request for revision and final decision, is sent by e-mail.

File Formats

Authors can submit files in Word, WordPerfect, RTF, TXT, or PDF.

Double-Blinded Peer Review

IMAGES uses a double-blinded peer review system, which means that manuscript author(s) do not know who the reviewers are, and that reviewers do not know the names of the author(s). Authors should therefore take care to eliminate any clue to their identity from the text of the manuscript, for instance, by ensuring that citations to their own work are in the third person. For the same reason, authors are advised to hold off on including acknowledgments until they finalize the manuscript for publication.

All files (manuscript, figures, tables, etc.) should not contain any information concerning author names, institutions, etc. The names of these files and document properties should also be anonymized.

Submission Requirements

Language

Manuscripts will be accepted in English (British or American). An author's priority should be consistency in whatever language their submission is written in. In general, please consult *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 16th ed. (Chicago: University of Chicago Press 2010; also available online at chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html for guidance.

General

Wide margins of at least 2.5 cm (1 inch) are to be left on all edges of the page. All parts (abstract, body, footnotes, etc.) must be double-spaced and numbered consecutively.

Non-Roman Scripts

If nonstandard fonts are used, such as Hebrew, copies of the font files must also accompany the submission file for publication purposes only. Characters that do not appear in the standard Roman alphabet (i.e., accented letters, diacritical marks) should be very plainly identified.

Transliteration

Transliteration of words and proper names in Greek, Arabic, Hebrew, etc., should be consistent throughout.

Manuscript Structure

The first page of the manuscript should carry the full title of the article followed by the Abstract. The remaining manuscript should be arranged in the following sequence:

Article text (with footnotes), Bibliography or reading list (if any), Appendices (if any), Figure captions (if any), Tables (if any), and Figures. Acknowledgements should be addressed as a non-numbered footnote which will appear before the first footnote. They should only be added once a manuscript is accepted for publication.

Abstract & Keywords

Abstracts should not exceed 150 words in English and give a brief summary of the article or an outline of its argumentation, or sum up the points discussed. Keywords (3-8) should also be provided.

Footnotes

Notes should be numbered consecutively throughout the text and follow any punctuation marks, such as a period or comma, within the text. References should be included within the notes (but any Reading List or Bibliography can be presented as the final section of the paper). Take care as to ensure that each footnote reference appears in the appropriate position in the text.

Italics

Please italicize matter that is intended to be italicized.

Style

In general, please consult *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 16th ed. (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2010; also available online at: chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html for guidance.

Quotations

Direct quotations of fewer than twenty-five words should be enclosed in double quotation marks (“ ”) and run on in the text.

Double quotation marks should also be used for titles of journal articles and reference works. Single quotation marks (' ') are used to enclose words and phrases within double quotation marks.

Block Quotes

Larger sections of quoted text (i.e. anything over twenty-five words) should be set off from other text by adding a blank line above and below the section and indenting the entire quotation 1.5 inches from the left. These larger sections, or block quotations, are not enclosed in quotation marks.

Figures

Images should be provided in electronic format. Line drawings should have a minimum resolution of 600 dpi [dots per inch]. Photographs should have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi. The file format should be .TIF(F) or .JPEG. Captions should contain the name of the art work, date, location, collection (if applicable), and permissions. Captions should be formatted as follows:

Publication

Proofs

A PDF of the article proofs will be sent to the author by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. Authors' alterations in excess of 10% of the original composition cost will be charged to authors. Proofs should be returned within one week of receipt.

E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to the corresponding author for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO green publisher. Authors are allowed to post the pdf post-print version of their articles on their own personal websites free of charge. This means they can show the article exactly as it appears in print. The institute employing the author is allowed to post the post-refereed, but pre-print version of articles free of charge on its repository. The post-refereed, pre-print version means the final accepted version of the manuscript before typesetting.

Consent to Publish

Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

Open Access

In case the author wishes to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish**.
