



## Scope

The *Journal of Greek Linguistics (JGL)* is an established peer-reviewed international journal dedicated to the descriptive and theoretical study of the Greek language from its roots in Ancient Greek down to present-day dialects and varieties. Its target audience includes specialists in both Ancient, Medieval and Modern Greek, besides general linguists.

## Ethical and Legal Conditions

Submission of an article for publication in any of Brills' journals implies the following:

1. All authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the journal.
2. The contents of the manuscript have been tacitly or explicitly approved by the responsible authorities where the research was carried out.
3. The manuscript has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language, except as an abstract, part of a published lecture or academic thesis.
4. The manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal.
5. If accepted, the author agrees to transfer copyright to BRILL and the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any form, in English or any other language, without prior written consent of the Publisher.
6. If the submission includes figures, tables, or large sections of text that have been published previously, the author has obtained written permission from the original copyright owner(s) to reproduce these items in the current manuscript in both the online and print publications of the journal. All copyrighted material has been properly credited in the manuscript. ## Submission

### *Double-blinded Peer Review*

All submitted papers will be subject to double-blinded peer review. For the purpose of reviewing the draft paper should be anonymous. No author details should be identifiable from the article itself or in the acknowledgements. The details of the author(s) should be submitted in a separate file and include the author's name, affiliation, full postal and e-mail addresses.

## Submission Requirements

### *General*

Papers that are submitted for initial consideration should be complete, including all notes, bibliographical references, tables, etc.

The journal reserves the right to copy-edit contributions to conform to its style.

Authors should not use desktop publishing features such as justification, centering, or bold-face type. Italics should be indicated by using proper italics. Do not hyphenate words at the end of a line. TAB should be restricted to a paragraph indent.

For general rules on style, see the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 16th ed., University of Chicago Press, 2010 ([chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html](http://chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html)), or the most recent edition) or the MLA Style Guide. The final draft of a manuscript accepted for publication must be submitted both as hard copy and electronically. Electronic files should be saved in .pdf format. Final versions and printouts must be proofread carefully before submission; please use your spelling and grammar check.

### *Language*

Articles and book reviews should be written in English. Spelling (British or American) should be consistent throughout.

### *Unicode and Non-Roman Fonts*

The Editors request the use of Unicode fonts only. Updated versions of Times New Roman in Microsoft Windows contains Greek Unicode fonts. For the complete list of Latin and IPA characters in Unicode: [brill.nl/downloads/Latin-and-IPA.pdf](http://brill.nl/downloads/Latin-and-IPA.pdf).

### *Transliteration and Orthography*

Where possible, all examples from languages not using the Latin alphabet should be transliterated using an accepted system of transliteration. Authors should use their chosen system consistently throughout the manuscript.

Where no standard system has been adopted in the literature (e.g. examples of certain dialects never described before), use symbols to represent sounds that are as close to the IPA symbols as possible, and give explanations where appropriate.



Where a transliteration system is already used in the literature, no new transliteration system invented by the author will be accepted. #### *Length*

Articles should not exceed 10.000 words (general and research articles) or 1500-3000 words for book reviews. The following should be included: abstract (100 to 150 words), up to six keywords, affiliation details and email address.

#### *Abstracts*

Articles should include a short abstract (150-250 words).

#### *Keywords*

Please supply 2-6 keywords (in lowercase letters), to be placed below the abstract, for indexing purposes.

## **Publication**

#### *Proofs*

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to the author by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. In the event of a multi-authored contribution, proofs are sent to the first-named author unless otherwise requested. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. Alterations to the original manuscript at this stage will result in considerable delay in publication and, therefore, are not accepted unless charged to the author. Proofs should be returned promptly.

#### *E-offprints*

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to the author of articles or review for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO green publisher. Authors are allowed to post the pdf post-print version of their articles on their own personal websites free of charge. This means they can show the article exactly as it appears in print. The institute employing the author is allowed to post the post-refereed, but pre-print version of articles free of charge on its repository. The post-refereed, pre-print version means the final accepted version of the manuscript before typesetting.



## Consent to Publish

### *Transfer of Copyright*

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

### *Open Access*

In case the author wishes to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish**.
