



Instructions for Authors

Scope

The *Journal for the Study of Judaism* (JSJ) is a leading international forum for scholarly discussions on the history, literature and religious ideas on Judaism in the Persian, Hellenistic and Roman periods. It provides biblical scholars, students of rabbinic literature, classicists and historians with essential information. Since 1970, the *Journal for Study of Judaism* has been securing its position as one of the world's leading journals. The *Journal for the Study of Judaism* features an extensive book review section as well as a separate section reviewing articles.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

Submission of an article for publication in any of Brills' journals implies the following:

1. All authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the journal.
2. The contents of the manuscript have been tacitly or explicitly approved by the responsible authorities where the research was carried out.
3. The manuscript has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language, except as an abstract, part of a published lecture or academic thesis.
4. The manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal.
5. If accepted, the author agrees to transfer copyright to BRILL and the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any form, in English or any other language, without prior written consent of the Publisher.
6. If the submission includes figures, tables, or large sections of text that have been published previously, the author has obtained written permission from the original copyright owner(s) to reproduce these items in the current manuscript in both the online and print publications of the journal. Submission

Articles will normally be put through a system of blind refereeing. It is therefore useful to include a title page with all author details, and an anonymised text file.

Submission Requirements

Language

Manuscripts should be written in English (British or American), French or German. Spelling should be consistent throughout.

Articles in English should follow the guidelines of *The SBL Handbook of Style*; sbl-site.org/assets/pdfs/SBLHS.pdf), also for citations of ancient texts, bibliographical references and abbreviations.

Articles in French and German should approximate this style in as far as possible.

Manuscript Requirements

Abstract and Keywords

After the author affiliation there should be a one-paragraph abstract (100 to 150 words) followed by 2-6 keywords.

Footnotes

Bibliographical references should be provided in footnotes.



Publication

Proofs

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to authors by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. The publisher reserves the right to charge authors for changes made to proofs other than correction of compositor's errors. Proof corrections should be returned promptly to the Editor-in-Chief: Florentino García Martínez, e-mail: F.Garcia.Martinez@theo.kuleuven.be. Page proofs are read by the editors.

E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to authors for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO green publisher. Authors are allowed to post the pdf post-print version of their articles on their own personal websites free of charge. This means they can show the article exactly as it appears in print. The institute employing the author is allowed to post the post-refereed, but pre-print version of articles free of charge on its repository. The post-refereed, pre-print version means the final accepted version of the manuscript before typesetting.

Consent to Publish

Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

Open Access

In case the author wishes to publish the article in Open Access he/she can choose the Brill Open option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special Brill Open Consent to Publish.
