



### Manuscript

- Manuscripts and articles should be submitted to the Editors to the following email address [ssm.brill@gmail.com](mailto:ssm.brill@gmail.com) in Word Format (\*.doc) or Rich Text Format (\*.rtf). They should include the author's email address, institutional affiliation and postal address.
- SSM publishes articles in French or English. It has a preference for academic works. Personal memoirs are unlikely to be sent to review.
- All articles should have an introduction, different sections and a conclusion. Use subtitles about once every three pages. The argument should be laid out clearly.
- Length of article: 7,000-14,000 words, including footnotes and bibliography
- Length of book reviews: 500-1000 words
- Citation should be in the text as footnotes (no end notes) and include complete citation information. SSM prefers not to publish long footnotes. Points important to the argument should come in the text while footnotes should be for references or brief disclaimers.
- We accept the American citation system with a bibliography at the end of the article. More details about style below.

### Submission and Evaluation

- Articles should be original contributions and should not be submitted to another publication at the same time.
- SSM is a peer-reviewed journal. All articles are read by at least two evaluators before being accepted, refused or sent back for revisions.
- The editors will strive to provide an answer within eight weeks after submission.

### Abstract and Keywords

- Journal article must include an abstract at the beginning of the article. The abstract consists of the aim, results and conclusion of the research. It is limited to 100 words.
- Please also provide a series of 5 (five) keywords that are important and relevant to your article.

### Referencing

The style of the footnotes should be as follows:

When the title has already been cited and reference is made to a particular page:

## Consent to publish

### *Transfer of copyright*

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

### *Open Access*

In case the author wishes to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish**.
