



Scope

Vigiliae Christianae (VC) contains articles and short notes of an historical, cultural, linguistic or philological nature on early Christian literature written after the New Testament, as well as on Christian epigraphy and archaeology. Church and dogmatic history are, where possible, dealt with in their relation to social history; Byzantine and medieval literature are treated as far as they exhibit continuity with the early Christian period.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

Submission of an article for publication in any of Brills' journals implies the following:

1. All authors are in agreement about the content of the manuscript and its submission to the journal.
2. The contents of the manuscript have been tacitly or explicitly approved by the responsible authorities where the research was carried out.
3. The manuscript has not been published previously, in part or in whole, in English or any other language, except as an abstract, part of a published lecture or academic thesis.
4. The manuscript has not and will not be submitted to any other journal while still under consideration for this journal.
5. If accepted, the author agrees to transfer copyright to Brill and the manuscript will not be published elsewhere in any form, in English or any other language, without prior written consent of the Publisher.
6. If the submission includes figures, tables, or large sections of text that have been published previously, the author has obtained written permission from the original copyright owner(s) to reproduce these items in the current manuscript in both the online and print publications of the journal. Submission

A disk or CD or an attachment to an e-mail message should only be sent on acceptance with a print of the revised manuscript. Both WordPerfect and Microsoft Word are accepted word-processing programs. ASCII-formatted disks are also accepted.



Submission Requirements

Language

Manuscripts should be submitted in English, French or German. Spelling should be consistent throughout.

Transliteration and Non-Roman Scripts

Authors are requested to check their manuscripts, and especially their quotations, most carefully, and to type out all Greek, as later corrections in the proof stage are expensive and time-consuming. Syriac, Hebrew and Coptic quotations should be transcribed unless the original version is indispensable.

Manuscript Structure

Manuscripts should be printed with a wide margin and double space between the lines. Please use one side of the paper only. The first page should have ample space at the top around the title.

Title

Titles should be as short as possible. A (shortened) running title should be provided.

Abstract and Keywords

An abstract of 100–150 words and 2–6 keywords, in English, should be provided.

Italics

Italics should be used sparingly (but see below).

Latin quotations should be printed in italic.

Footnotes and References

The Journal uses footnotes, and not endnotes or a reference list. The titles of books and of journals (not of papers in journals) should be given in italics. For example:

Publication

Proofs

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to authors by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these. At this stage in the production process only minor corrections are allowed. Alterations to the original manuscript at this stage will result in considerable delay in publication and, therefore, are not accepted unless charged to the author. Proof corrections should be returned promptly.

E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to authors for personal use. Brill is a RoMEO green publisher. Authors are allowed to post the pdf post-print version of their articles on their own personal websites free of charge. This means they can show the article exactly as it appears in print. The institute employing the author is allowed to post the post-refereed, but pre-print version of articles free of charge on its repository. The post-refereed, pre-print version means the final accepted version of the manuscript before typesetting.

Consent to Publish

Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

Open Access

In case the author wishes to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option, which allows for a non-exclusive Open Access publication in exchange for an Article Publishing Fee, and sign a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish**.
